RULES & REGULATIONS

General Rules & Regulations for Students

1. All students admitted in Mar Elias College must observe the rules and regulations that may framed from time to time by the management to ensure peaceful campus atmosphere.
2. Every student is responsible for proper handling and safe custody of any apparatus/equipment that he/she may be using. In case of any intentional or negligent damage or loss to the college property, the student shall have to pay the cost of repair or replacement.
3. Ragging of any kind is strictly prohibited. Any student found ragging shall be strictly punished by the management as per the law and rules of Kerala Government Ragging Prohibition Act 1998.
4. 75% attendance is compulsory in all academic activities. Students failing to attain the prescribed attendance will not be allowed to appear in the University Examination.
5. On the basis of the orders issued by various government authorities, the use of mobile phones in the college campus by the

students is strictly prohibited. A fine of Rs. 500/- will be imposed on those who violates this rule. Phone/Sim card will not be returned under any circumstances. A surprise inspection squad is formed to implement this rule. The students are allowed to use the phone from Office/Department in the case of emergency.

6. The college campus is smoking/alcohol free zone.

7. Students are prohibited from organizing or attending meetings in the college, distributing notices, collecting money and exhibiting banners, flags, posters etc without permission of the Principal. Political campaigning /organizational activities are banned in the campus, save those official activities which are specifically permitted or sponsored by the college authorities.

8. Any unhealthy relationship between students which might affect their academic performance, breach their personal space or affect the reputation of the institution will be strictly dealt with.

9. Students must park their vehicles only in the allotted space at their own risk. They should not bring four wheelers to the campus. Stunting & racing of vehicles within the campus is strictly banned. The security/college staff are authorized to inspect the records of the vehicles entering the campus.

10. Students shall always wear identity cards issued by the college with tag and show them as and when demanded by the Principal, teachers, office staff & security staff. Discipline committee shall have the powers to deny admission to students to classes/offices/labs/library/meeting/cultural programmes and other programmes in case of violation of the dress code of the college.

11. All students should reach the classroom on time and shall not leave the campus without permission of HoDs/Class in charges/ Principal during the class time.

12. Students who want to avail college bus facility in between the semester will have to pay full bus fee for the entire semester.

Students those who are not requested the bus facility but found in travelling by college bus will be charged with full bus fee as fine.

13. Parents must attend the PTA meetings and open houses. They should verify the progress report and signed it and enquire about their child's academic progress.

14. The fee schedule for all categories of students is the beginning of each semester. In case a fee is not deposited till the due date, a fine will be charged. Once the fee is deposited, it will not be refunded, transferred or adjusted in any other account. If a student leaves the course in mid-term, he/she is liable to pay the balance of fee for the whole course.

15. Complaints of students will be looked in to if they are presented through proper channel. Any case of criminal activity or violation of law and order in the campus will be reported to the police and the police need to be register case and initiate action against offenders. Matters not covered by these rules are left to the discretion of the Principal and his/her decision shall be final.

16. Students who want to participate in extracurricular and co-curricular activities get prior written permission from the Principal through applications forwarded by concerned HoDs.

17. The College Management and Principal shall be final authority in the interpretation of the college rules.

College Library

Working Hours of the Library:

9.15 am to 4.15 pm

Library Rules and Regulations:

General Rules:

- # Silence to be maintained.
- # Enter your name and sign in the register kept at the entrance before entering.
- # Library Identity Card is compulsory for getting access to the library.

- # No discussion permitted inside the library.
 - # No personal belongings are allowed inside the library.
 - # Using Mobile phones is strictly prohibited in the library premises.
- Library borrower cards are not transferable. The borrower is responsible for the books borrowed on his/her card. Refreshment of any kind shall not be taken anywhere in the library premises

Admission to Library:

Students are allowed to library only on production of their Identity Cards

Circulation Issue System:

Books will be issued on presentation of the library card along with the ID card. Students are instructed to check the books while borrowing and they will be responsible for any type of damage or mutilation noticed at the time of return.

Overdue Charges:

Materials borrowed should be returned on or before the due date, if returned late overdue fine will be charged for the delayed period.

Books Lost:

If the books are lost, then the borrower shall replace the books of the same edition or latest edition or pay the double cost of the book.

Loss of Cards:

Loss of borrower card should be reported to the librarian. Duplicate card may be issued against fine.

Validity of Cards:

Library borrower cards are valid for the entire duration of the course to access library facilities. At the end of the course borrower cards shall be returned to the library.

No Dues Certificate

Each student shall obtain No dues certificate from the library after returning all the books issued, surrendering the borrower's cards and after paying outstanding dues, if any. Students are required to handle the books/ Journal very carefully. Marking with pencil, writing or highlighting, tearing the pages or mutilating the same in any other way will be viewed very seriously.

Reference Section

This section has Encyclopedia, Dictionaries, Textbooks, Reference books etc. which are only available for reference. User can make use of these resources.

Journal Section

In this section journals and general magazines are available. The latest issues are displayed on display rack.

Dress Code and Identity Card

A dress code is maintained in our college adhering to the spirit of discipline and sense of decorum. Students shall always wear identity cards issued by the college with tag and show them as and when demanded by the Principal, teachers, office staff & security staff. Discipline committee shall have the powers to deny admission to students to classes/offices/labs/library/meeting/cultural programmes and other programmes in case of violation of the dress code of the college.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE

1. University and College rules require REGULAR ATTENDANCE for both theory and practical hours. Attendance is noted for each period.
2. A Student who is not in the class when attendance is taken shall be marked absent. If a student absents oneself even for one hour, she shall lose attendance for that entire session.
3. For attending pre-planned events and programmes, prior permission for leave needs to be taken. In case of emergency situations, the Parent or Guardian or Warden of the hostel has to inform of the absence to the Faculty In-charge.
4. The attendance of every student will be summed up at the end of each semester.
5. 75% of attendance is compulsory for attending University Examination.

ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

PG

Age Limit: There is no age limit for applying to various post graduate programmes conducted in colleges affiliated to the University.

- (i) Candidates should have passed the corresponding Degree Examination under the 10 + 2 + 3 pattern with one core/main subject and two complementary/subsidiary subjects from any of the Universities in Kerala or of any other University

recognized by Mahatma Gandhi University as equivalent there to for admission, subject to the stipulation regarding marks.

OR

- (ii) Candidates who have passed Degree examination with Double or Triple main subject +or candidates who have passed the Degree Examination in Vocational or Specialized Programmes are also eligible for admission. However, they have to submit copy of the Equivalency/Eligibility Certificate from Mahatma Gandhi University, stating that, their Qualifying Examination is recognized for seeking admission to the relevant P.G. Degree Course(s) as applicable, at the time of admission. This provision is not applicable in the case of those applicants who have passed their qualifying examination from MG University.

- (iii) The minimum requirements for admission to PG Degree Programmes are:

UG ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

In the case of candidates who have passed examinations of other Boards/Institutes/Governments, except CBSE/CISCE, they shall be admitted only if these examinations have been declared equivalent to the qualifying examinations of MG University.

Age Limit: There is no upper and lower age limit for admission to undergraduate programmes. However the upper age limit for admission through sports quota is 25 years.

No candidate shall be admitted to the degree programme unless he/she possess the qualifications and minimum requirements thereof.

Admission to the BCom Degree Programmes shall be open only to candidates who have passed the Plus Two or Equivalent examination recognized by this university with Book-Keeping and Accountancy and any two of the following subjects. viz.(1)Commerce (2) Commercial Correspondence and Commercial Geography (3) Economics (4) Life insurance with Salesmanship (5) Banking with Secretarial Practice (6) Business Studies (7) Mathematics (8) Computer Science/Computer Application (9) Informatics Practice and Management (10) Informatics Practice (11) Management (12) Accountancy as optional under Part III of the Examination

Relaxation of Marks:

For SC/ST applicants and ST applicants of Lakshadweep, only a pass minimum is required and for SEBC and OEC applicants 3% and 5% relaxation of marks respectively are allowed.

- **BA English - Model II (Administrative Assistant)**

Candidates who have passed Plus Two or equivalent examination or an examination recognised by MG University as equivalent thereto.

- **Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA):** Candidates shall be required to have passed Plus Two or equivalent examination or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto by this University .
- **Bachelor of Social Work (BSW):** Candidates shall be required to have passed Plus Two or equivalent examination or an examination recognised by this University as equivalent thereto.
- **Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA):** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Plus Two/equivalent examination in Science stream with Mathematics/Computer Science/ Informatics Practices as optional.
- **BSc Computer Science Model III:** Candidates shall be required to have passed the Plus Two/equivalent examination with Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

Online Students' Grievance Redressal Portal

The Online Student's Grievance Redressal System is a new initiative taken by the University Grants Commission that facilitates students/complaints to lodge his or her grievance, send reminder and view status on action taken with regard to their grievance(s). The basic aim of the portal is to ensure transparency in admissions, prevent unfair practices in higher educational institutions and provide a mechanism for redressal of their grievances. The system also facilitates the Universities to search and browse grievances lodged against their University and post action taken against the complaints on the portal as well as contact the complaint directly through e-mail, phone or by post.

Students' Grievance Redressal Cell

The cell functions to look into the grievances lodged by any

student. Students may approach the cell to voice their grievances regarding academic matters, health services, library and other services. Any form of discontent or dissatisfaction on the part of the students can be informed to the cell. The Grievance cell also looks into matters of harassment. Anyone with a genuine grievance may approach the Co-ordinator or member of the Students' Grievance cell. Grievances may also be sent through e-mail to the Co-ordinator of the Students' Grievance Cell. The cell then redresses the grievances promptly and judiciously. As a result of this mechanism, the institute has pleasant ambient atmosphere and good work culture with in-built goodwill and mutual understanding among the students.

Objective

The main objective of the Grievance Cell is to promote and maintain a conducive and harmonious educational environment among the students. The Students' Grievance Cell is constituted for the redressal of the problems reported by the students of the College. This is with the following objectives in mind

- Grievance Cell is formed in order to keep the healthy working atmosphere amongst staff, students and parents.
- This cell helps Students to record their complaints and solve their problems related to academics, resources and personal grievances freely and frankly without any fear of victimization.
- To keep the dignity of the college high by ensuring conflict free atmosphere in the College by promoting good Student-Student relationship and Student-Teacher relationship.
- To ensure effective solution to the student grievances with an impartial and fair approach.
- In order to advising Students of the College to respect each other and be patient whenever any occasion of conflict arises.
- To advise all the students to refrain from stirring up students against other students, teachers and College administration.
- Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited in and outside the Institution. Any violation of ragging and disciplinary rules should

be urgently brought to the notice of the Principal. Ragging Complaints will be handled as per ragging rules.

- Woman Harassment complaints will be handled as per government guidelines by respective section.

Scope

The cell will deal with Grievances received in writing from the students about any of the following matters:

- Academic Matters: Related to timely issue of duplicate Mark-sheets, Transfer Certificates, Conduct Certificates or other examination related matters.
- Financial matters: Related to dues and payments for various items from library, hostels etc.
- Other Matters: Related to certain misgivings about conditions of sanitation, preparation of food, availability of transport, victimization by teachers etc.

Functions

- Complaint Boxes have been installed in the College campus in which the Students, who want to remain anonymous, can put in writing their grievances and their suggestions for improving the academics/administration in the College.
- Students can lodge a complaint.
- The person concerned can personally approach to any member of the Cell and can send email (email id: grievancesmec@gmail.com) or write an application and submit to Cell Convenor for grievances of any sort.
- The cases will be attended promptly on receipt of grievances from the students.
- The cell will review all cases and will act formally accordingly as per the management policy.
- The cell will give report to the authority about the cases attended to and the number of pending cases, if any, which require direction

and guidance from the higher authorities.

Exclusions

The Grievance Redressal Cell shall not entertain the following issues:

- Decisions of the executive council, academic council, board of studies and other administrative or academic committees constituted by the university.
- Decisions with regard to award of scholarship, fee concessions, medals etc.
- Decisions made by the university with regard to disciplinary matters and misconduct.
- Decisions of the university about admissions in any courses offered by the Institute.

Decisions by competent authority on assessment and examination result.

Anti-Ragging Cell

Ragging means the doing of any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.

Administrative Action In The Event of Ragging:

The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.

The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Cell, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
- Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
- Cancellation of admission.
- Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

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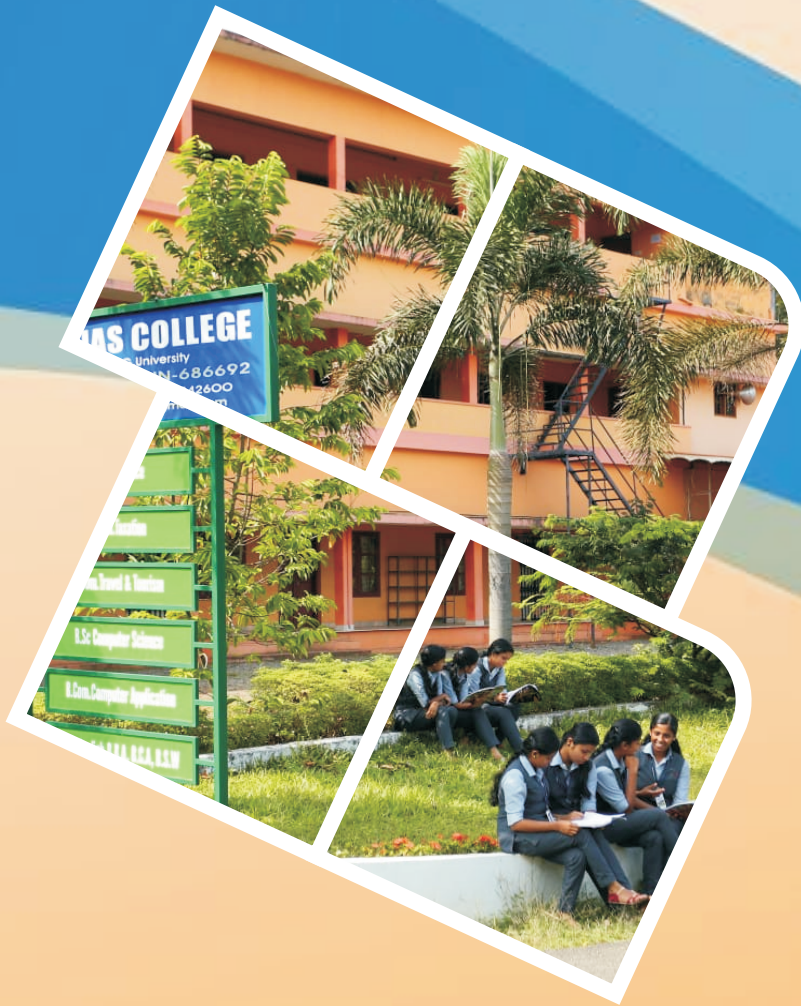
